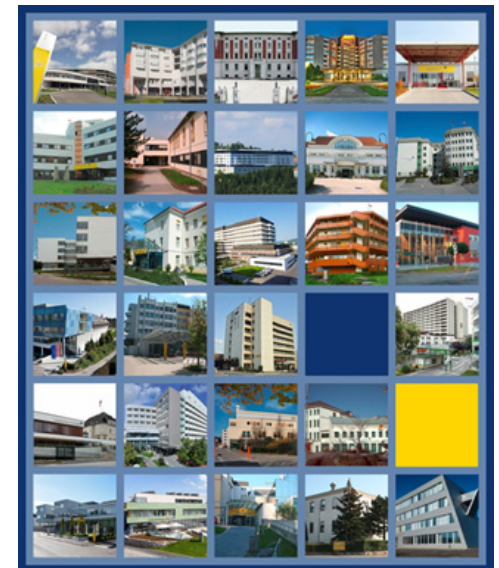

### Behaviour in the case of an imminent miscarriage

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**Dear Patient,**

Further to our discussion at discharge and the doctor's letter, we would like to provide you with some more information relating to the time after your stay in our department.

**Symptoms**

Indicators of an imminent miscarriage are bleeding or abdominal cramps in early pregnancy as well as dragging pain in the lower back.

**Guidelines for behaviour**

Physical rest continues to be necessary after discharge. We recommend a short-term follow-up examination with your attending consultant. If the bleeding and/or abdominal cramps reoccur, you should visit the hospital.
